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NATIONAL MOBILE GENDARMERIE OF FRANCE

The National Mobile Gendarmerie of France is the subdivision of the Military National Gendarmerie that is subordinated to both the Ministry of the Interior of France and the Ministry of Defense. Alongside the Departmental Gendarmerie the National Mobile Gendarmerie of France performs the following administrative (police) functions: maintenance of public order, security, persistent protection of zone tasks; decentralization of formation at the province level.

The National Gendarmerie of France has the following structure: Departmental Gendarmerie performs three types of missions: judicial police under the control of the judicial authority (prosecutor's office, judges of instructions), administrative police under the control of the administrative authority and military missions. The first two missions are common to the Police and the Gendarmerie, the last being a specificity of the Gendarmerie.

In organizing the activities of the patrol service, great importance is attached to the development and improvement of tactical patrol techniques. It is in France where patrol missions are characterized by a variety of forms: automobile, horseback, foot patrol outfits are widely used. In addition, patrols on motorcycles, bicycles, and during the World Cup are actively used. In Paris, Marseilles, and Lyon, the public order service was carried out by specially selected and trained outfits of police officers on roller skates, which proved to be excellent.

That is, Mobile Gendarmerie interacts with Departmental Gendarmerie to protect public order. The mobile gendarmerie forces are subject to a new doctrine. This doctrine combines security requirements with law enforcement requirements. The formations of gendarmerie in this area perform the following tasks: maintaining public order, providing security, (fighting crime, emergency care, and search activities), persistent protection of zone tasks, decentralized education.

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
